General information/Instructions for the candidates appearing for written test for the positions of Superintendent (Accounts), Junior Assistant, Junior Lab Assistant, Junior Engineer (Civil) & Junior Engineer (Electrical) with AC/refrigerator specialization on contract

The selection process shall have two tier tests: -

Tier-I will consist of the objective type written examination for screening and shortlisting, common to all the four categories of posts mentioned above and

Tier-II at the second level examination for the shortlisted candidates will be in the form of a job specific written test. Merit list for final selection will be made only based on qualifying marks obtained in the Tier-II examination.

The pattern of Examination for Tier-I:

- 1. The **Tier-I** examination will be of 1 hour duration.
- 2. It will comprise multiple choice (4 each A, B, C & D) questions with only one correct Answer.
- 3. Two (2) marks will be awarded for each correct answer and minus one (-1) mark for each incorrect Answer.
- 4. There will be 50 Questions in the **Tier-I** exam.
- 5. Question paper and Answer key of **Tier-I** shall be uploaded on the website on the same day of exam for objections if any (to be submitted with supporting documents if necessary) on the Answer key which requires to be submitted within three working days.
- 6. Final Answer key and result of **Tier-I** shall be displaced on the website after checking the objections within seven days.
- 7. <u>Tie breaker rule</u>: if there is a tie on MCQ marks for the last position to be shortlisted for **Tier-II** exam, then all such tied candidates shall be shortlisted for **Tier-II** exam
- 8. **Short listing for Tier-II exam:** 3 times for UR positions and 4 times for Reserved categories positions.
- 9. <u>Medium of Instructions</u>: The medium of instructions of the Question Paper shall be English. The candidates require to attempt the answers in English only.

Tier-I 100 marks (Syllabus) (50 Questions)

English Language: sentence completion/correction, inferences, Reading comprehension, English Grammar, Verbal Analogies, Critical reasoning, Word meaning, Synonyms and Antonyms

Numerical Ability: Arithmetic up to 10th Standard. Numerical computation, Numerical Estimation, Numerical Reasoning, Data reasoning and Data interpretation.

General Knowledge: Current affairs, Indian History, Indian Polity, Indian constitution, General Economics & Geography-up to 10th Standard.

Computer Proficiency: Knowledge of MS Windows and MS Office, Internet and email working.

Tier-II Post related General awareness & aptitude (Syllabus) shall be declared subsequently.

Instructions to be followed by the candidates inside Examination Hall

Before the written test begins:

- a) List of candidates showing their allotted rooms, seats, roll numbers, will be pasted at conspicuous places at the Lecture Hall Complex, IISER Mohali. Candidates should find and sit only at the seat allotted to them inside the examination hall.
- b) Candidates appearing for the written test from a room or seat other than the one allotted to them will have their candidature cancelled.
- c) The invigilator will communicate the important instructions to be followed during the exam.
- d) A sealed test booklet and an OMR sheet will be provided to candidates.
- e) Candidates must open the question booklet only after the commencement of the written test.
